SOUTH EAST LONDON INTERGROUP (WEST)

Service Positions Available at Intergroup.....

All service positions at Intergroup are vital to keeping AA running and healthy. There follows a list of service commitments currently available at SELIG (WEST) that you, someone in your group or a sponsee would benefit from doing:

Health Liaison Officer (HLO)

With much activity going on in this service area at SELIG (West), it is a matter of some urgency that this very important service position is filled now that the former HLO has rotated out of service. A Health Liaison Officer is responsible for establishing links with health professionals and co-ordinating all aspects of carrying the message within the healthcare system. SELIG (WEST) has already made an incredible start in reaching the next generation of doctors; the first Open Meeting Workshop for medical students at King's College Hospital took place in February 2022, and following the success of this Workshop, King's were eager to have them introduced into their teaching schedule. The hospital has an annual intake of some 400 students and the aim is to hold Workshops for as many students as possible. Workshops are held with around 40 students at a time, first starting with a presentation about AA which is then followed by members running a real AA meeting, then finally a Question & Answer session. In addition to these workshops, SELIG (WEST) also organises Twelfth Step visits to patients on the wards at King's, as well as other activities in the Intergroup area.

Other service positions available...

<u>Electronic Communications Liaison Officer</u> (ECLO)

This service role principally involves maintaining the SELIG (West) Microsite, and amongst other things, also involves attending ECLO London committee meetings.

Treasurer

The Intergroup Treasurer has responsibility for keeping a proper account of all Intergroup finances and ensuring that funds are available for its essential current requirements.

Public Information (PI)

The Public Information Officer is responsible for ensuring that information about the AA message and programme of recovery is conveyed to outside organisations to the best possible advantage. The service commitment will thus involve working with any outside events or institutions in order to attract the still suffering alcoholic to A.A.

Armed Services Liaison Officer (ASLO)

The role of the Intergroup Armed Services Liaison Officer is to establish local links with The Royal Navy, The Army and The Royal Air Force, and any other organisations connected with the Armed Services such as Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Families Association (SSAFA) and Veterans-UK.

Probation Liaison Officer

The Probation Liaison Officer is responsible for establishing links with the Probation Services and to keep Intergroup informed on a regular basis.

Regional Representative

The Regional Representative is the link between the Intergroup and Region in a similar way that the GSR is the link between the group and Intergroup.

Young People's Liaison Officer (YPLO)

The YPLO will be someone who came into AA at the age of thirty or younger. The service commitment will involve establishing close working relations with other service disciplines, in particular the Public Information Officer to assist with presentations where the audience is likely to include a significant proportion of young people, such as talks to schools, universities and young offenders' institutions etc.
