



2020 Alcoholics Anonymous (Hard cover)

Often referred to as 'The Big Book', Alcoholics Anonymous is the basic text book used by AA members. The first eleven chapters give a detailed explanation of the Twelve Step programme used in Alcoholics Anonymous. The rest of the publication consists of personal experiences of members on their problems with alcohol and how they recovered using the AA programme.

The contents is exactly as 2020 but the publication is bound in a soft cover (18x11cm).




Awareness of this is essential for the protection of new members, sponsors and the fellowship generally and may have legal and/or safeguarding implications.
